### Summary of Changes

#### Teaching

1. **We are hoping that all students will join us in York but are planning to teach all programmes in a manner that can be accessed remotely**

We are encouraging but not expecting all postgraduate students to be in York in Autumn 2021.

Throughout the academic year, we will provide online support to students who are unable to attend in-person teaching (for example, because of travel restrictions or self-isolation). For those elements of a module that are in person, our intention is to provide a meaningful online learning experience for these students. Those elements of a module that are online only will be accessible equally to all students.

### Assessment

All essays/coursework/projects and exams will be **online**. All exams will be **“24 hour open exams”**.

We have no plans to change programme structures at postgraduate level, or to withdraw or reschedule any taught postgraduate modules.
