Summary of Changes

Assessment

There are no changes to the assessment formats from 2020-2021. We will continue to assess students through a combination of coursework and open, online exams. We do not intend to run closed exams.

There are no changes to the structure of the MSc programmes:

- MSc Psychology in Education
- MSc in Mental Health and Wellbeing in Education

However, there are some changes to the structure of the six MA programmes:

- MA in Education
- MA in Global and International Citizenship Education
- MA in Applied Linguistics for English Language Teaching
- MA in Applied Linguistics for Language Teaching
- MA in Social Justice and Education
- MA in Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages

Research Methods in Education core module (20 credits) and Planning and Communicating Research (20 credits) core module shared across the six programmes will be restructured as follows:

- Research Methods in Education will be formed and taught as two separate

modules:

- Research Methods for Education 1: Researching Questions (20 credits)
– will run in the Autumn term
- Research Methods for Education 2: Answering Questions (20 credits) –
will run in the Spring term

The spring term Research Methods for Education 2 will replace the Planning and Communicating Research module.
