Summary of Changes

There are no changes to assessment methods. We'll continue to assess students through coursework submissions and presentations, and specific assessment plans will be available for each module by the start of the module. Students will retain the opportunities to present their work in class both in person and online in small group classes.

For students on the MA in Global Social Policy, we are intending to replace the 20 credit Making Global Social Policy module with the 10 credit Reflective Practice, and the 10 credit Graduate Research Workshop to ensure that all of our Masters students have the same opportunities to learn together.

Other than this, we are not planning to make any changes to these degree programme structures, and the modules remain as already advertised.
