Summary of Changes
We'll be continuing to assess students through a combination of coursework and online exams, and specific assessment plans will be available for each module by the start of the module.
There will be no changes to the structures of our programmes. As usual, in addition to our core modules, students will choose from a wide range of option modules taught by specialists, which change each year. Students are offered the opportunity to indicate their preferences and are allocated to modules via the module app. We ensure that the most students possible get the highest of their choices preferable.
If Covid restrictions allow, we will be asking the University to allow closed exams as part of the assessment for our stage 3 Special Subject modules as in normal years. If closed exams are not possible, all assessments will be online.
If Covid restrictions allow, students will still have the opportunity to participate in study abroad and placement year activities.
