## Summary of Overall Plans - Year 1

Students on these programmes will be invited to engage in learning in a variety of ways, with flexibility built in to allow us to maximise face-to-face teaching in line with any shifts in the government guidance on physical distancing. Lectures will be pre-recorded and put on the VLE, and small group teaching will be offered both in classrooms and online.

We will timetable as many students as we can fit in classroom sessions, giving all students face-to-face opportunities in turn. For the sessions that students do not get a seat , there will be a timetabled online version of the classroom session (attended regularly by those who are not able to attend campus as well as those who might be self-isolating) that will include the same kind of lively interactions and meet the same learning outcomes.

We will be continuing to assess students through a combination of coursework and online exams, and specific assessment plans will be available for each module by the start of the module.
